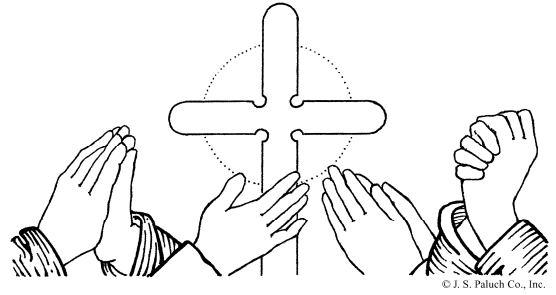

My dear friends in Christ,

Understanding our faith is of great importance. A lot of times we do things and a lot of times we have no clue why we do what we do. I believe that if we have some knowledge or understanding of why we do these things, it makes a big difference in our practice of our faith. This weekend I would like to share with you the difference between liturgical prayer and devotional prayer.

In the Jewish tradition, fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are very important religious tradition. ***Almsgiving*** has to do with helping people---lending a hand, giving money, time or resources to others. ***Fasting*** means abstaining from food or particular foods for certain periods of time, usually for spiritual reasons. ***And prayer*** is a “conversation with God.” ***It is a positive response to God’s call*** to be in relationship with him every day. I have been asked by people about the ***difference between liturgical and devotional prayer.***

LITURGICAL PRAYER:

The liturgical prayer is the Church’s public worship. The word “**liturgy**” means a “**public work**” or a “service in the name of, or on behalf of, the whole people.” Liturgical prayer is not a collective private prayer but the prayer of the assembly, joined together as God’s people. It means, in Christian tradition, liturgy is the participation of the people of God in the “work of God,” that is, the public worship of God by his church. The liturgical worship of the Church includes the sacrifice of the Mass, the sacraments, and the Divine Office or the Liturgy of the Hours. ***The Eucharistic Celebration is the primary worship experience for the Catholic Christians.*** It is in the liturgy, ***especially in the divine sacrifice of the Eucharist, that the “work of our redemption is accomplished,”*** and it is through the liturgy that the people of God offer praise and thanksgiving to our God. Because of this, the Church calls the faithful (us) to “full participation” in this work. The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy reads: ***“Those who have faith in Christ, when present at this mystery of faith, should not be there as strangers or silent spectators; on the contrary, through an adequate understanding of the rites and prayers, they should take part in the sacred action conscious of what they are doing.”***

The people present at the Eucharistic celebration are not bystanders or, in any way, secondary to the ministers assisting in the liturgical celebration. ***Each person’s participation in this public prayer of the Church is important.***

DEVOTIONAL PRAYERS:

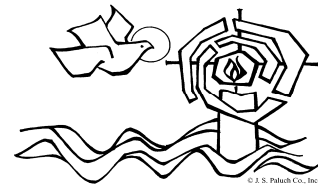
The devotional prayers are actions that are not strictly a part of liturgy proper but associated with it to a greater or lesser degree. ***There are two types of devotional prayers.***

First, those that are extension of the sacraments, for example, exposition of the Blessed Sacrament; and, ***second,*** those devotions that may be done privately or in a group, such as the recitation of the Holy Rosary, the Stations of the Cross, and novenas.

In conclusion, the liturgy of the Church, found in the celebration of ***the Eucharist and the sacraments and in the liturgy of the Hours,*** has precedence over devotional prayers because liturgical prayer is a celebration of the whole Body of Christ. ***However, devotional prayer has always held an important place in the spiritual life of the Church and, even when devotional prayer is private, the graces received from the prayer flow out to strengthen the whole Body of Christ.***

SAINT JOHN FISHER (1469-1535) AND SAINT THOMAS MORE (1477-1535)

June 22

From Robert Bolt's classic *A Man For All Seasons* to *Showtime's* edgy *The Tudors*, Thomas More endears himself still: lawyer-statesman of impeccable integrity, remarried widower and affectionate father delighting in a lively household—four children, a pet monkey, even a paid jester! And challenges still: humanist-reformer, yet champion of Catholic faith and papal primacy. John Paul II named him "Patron of Statesmen and Politicians," citing More's generous work, both as a lawyer and in government service, on behalf of the poorest and most marginalized people of his time, as well as his promotion of education for all sectors of society. More's decision for principle over politics, conscience over convenience prompted his final words: "I die the King's good servant, but God's first." Alone among England's bishops, John Fisher dared challenge Henry VIII's divorce and repudiation of the papacy. When the Pope named the imprisoned Fisher a cardinal, Henry thundered: "Don't bother sending Fisher's red hat here; I'll send Fisher's head to Rome!" Whose "good servants" are we first? Isn't a right conscience worth the pain of standing alone?

SVDP WHITE ELEPHANT BOOTH FOR THE FESTIVAL NEEDS DONATIONS FROM PARISHIONERS, INDIVIDUALS AS WELL AS BUSINESS FOR OUR BOOTH

Are you doing Spring Cleaning? Please save items to donate to the St. Vincent De Paul White Elephant booth at the Festival in July. Your generosity during the year of money and items help us to provide care and services to those in need. Due to the higher operating costs, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul of Alameda County (SVdP) can no longer accept donations of goods and items that are not in usable condition. We do not accept mattresses, wall-to-wall carpet, tires, bath tubs, sinks, toilets, paint, oils, large appliances, baby cribs, baby car seats, bikes, bowling balls, exercise equipment, skis, gas lawn mowers.

Here is a wish list and items very popular for our booth. Hope you can help: Small appliances, clothing (all sizes) children's toys, books, backpacks, school supplies, linens, bedspreads, sheets, towels, table clothes, napkins, blankets, small electronic items in good working condition, clocks, radios, tables, chairs, lamps, pictures, desk, living and bedroom furniture, lounge chairs, patio furniture, utensils, dishes, bowls, glasses, cups, pots and pans, baking pans, roasters, serving platters, picture frames. All furniture and E-waste materials must be delivered directly to the booth on Saturday, July 24th. We are now required to keep a formal log and documentation of all TV and Monitor items with registration of names and addresses of those donating these items. It is for safety protections and we cannot sell or use them without this completed form. It must be done before we put them into the booth. **WE DO NOT HAVE TRUCKS OR PEOPLE AVAILABLE TO COME PICK ITEMS UP**
