Fifth Sunday of Easter May 22, 2011

"I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." — John 14:6



My dear friends in Christ,

Last year I had a rare chance to talk to Bishop Sylvester Ryan during our annual priests retreat at Del Mar in Santa Cruz, California. For those who don't know him, Bishop Ryan was the former bishop of the diocese of Monterey. He is a very pastoral person. He and the late Archbishop Thomas Murphy of Seattle are the two figures most passionate and recognized in this field. I decided to ask him for some guidance and wisdom. At the end of my letter I will share with you Archbishop Murphy's three principles of stewardship.

One of the most compelling arguments that he shared with me on stewardship is that "stewardship is a source of grace, because it reminds us that God never stops giving and that everything we have (and all that we are) comes to us as God's free gift." This is the heart of the Bishops' Pastoral Letter, Stewardship: A Disciple's Response. Here in this pastoral letter, it describes a Christian steward as "one who receives God's gifts gratefully, cherishes and tends them in a responsible and accountable manner, and returns them with increase to the Lord."

What is the premise then of stewardship?

1. Because God never stops giving, a Christian steward is constantly being invited to receive, cherish, share, and return with increase the fruits of God's abundant generosity.

That week I came home to our parish community with a renewed commitment and with a greater sense of who I am as a servant and steward of God's grace. I came home also with three principles that are essential in living out the heart of stewardship from Archbishop Murphy's reflection on the pastoral letter.

THE THREE PRINCIPLES OF STEWARDSHIP:

1. Each and every baptized person is called to be disciple of Jesus Christ. However, above and beyond this basic call to ministry and the Christian vocation, mature disciples make a conscious, firm decision, carried out in action, to be followers of Jesus Christ, no matter the cost to themselves.

2. Beginning in conversion, a change of heart, this commitment is expressed not in a single action, not even in a series of actions over a period of time, but in an entire way of life. It means committing one's very self to the Lord.

3. Stewardship is an expression of discipleship with the power to change how we understand and live out our lives. Disciples who practice stewardship recognize God as origin of life, the giver of freedom, the source of all they have and are and will be.

I hope that in some way or another I can help you reflect on the grace of stewardship.
