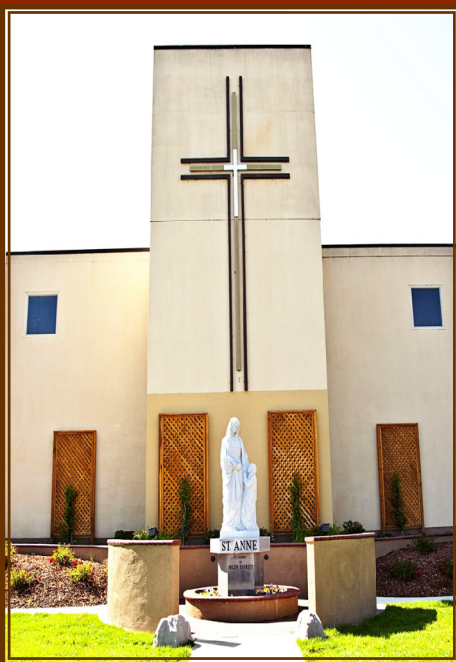

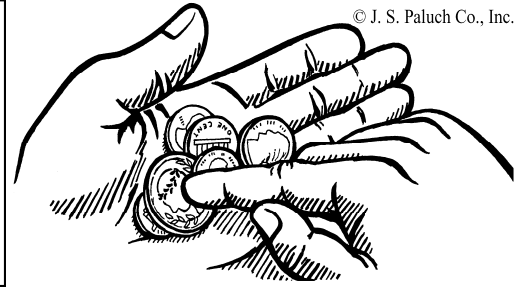

My dear friends in Christ,

Last Sunday I shared with you the meaning of the Eucharist! This weekend I would like to share with you as a follow up the list of Church Etiquette that a parishioner gave me a long time ago. I am sharing this WITH SOME REVISIONS.

- 1. Please show the importance of the Eucharistic celebration by dressing appropriately.*
- 2. Please respect God and other parishioners by arriving on time, and not speaking during the mass.*
- 3. Please turn off cell phones and other electronic devices (or leave them in the car, and not answer them if you forget to turn them off.*
- 4. Please don't chew gum, eat and drink during Mass and please don't ask for change during collection.*
- 5. Please honor the Word of God by listening attentively and being on time to hear it.*
- 6. Please acknowledge the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist and receive Holy Communion with reverence by*
 - a. making a slight bow with the head when approaching the Eucharist*
 - b. saying "Amen" not "Thank You" with conviction and joy*
 - c. placing the Eucharist immediately into your mouth*
 - d. staying after Communion to pray and to give thanks*
- 7. Please participate fully by singing and saying the common prayers ("full and conscious")*
- 8. Please offer hospitality by cleaning up the pew when you leave even if you are not responsible for the mess*
- 9. Please stay to receive the final blessing and please stay until the presider and ministers have processed out*
- 10. Please treat the Church property (bathrooms, gardens, etc) as a Holy Ground by not throwing trash on the ground and not writing on bathroom and church walls, tables, etc).*

May you find joy in your humble heart to practice these things! I believe that many of us have not fully understood and grasped the meaning of our celebration. ***We cannot continue to ignore these realities and important aspects of who we are as a celebrating community.*** Everything that we do here is very essential in our relationship with God and with one another. ***Only in God that we find complete joy and peace in life. Hope in him! Believe in him! He is our God! He is our God who loves! HE IS THE SAME YESTERDAY, TODAY AND FOREVER! The ALPHA and the OMEGA, the BEGINNING and the END!***

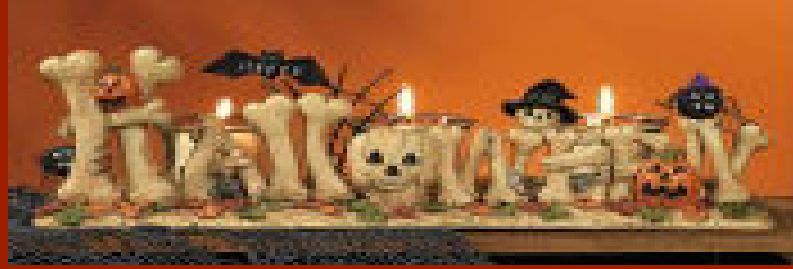

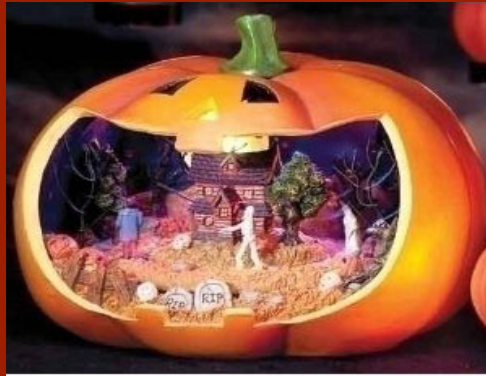
