Call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

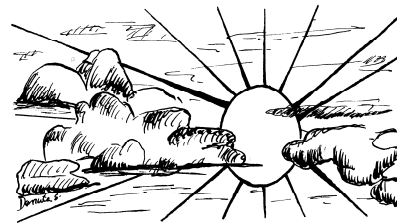

UNDERSTANDING OUR FAITH: CHURCH AS CATHOLIC AND HOLY

My dear friends in Christ,

Finally, finally we had a taste of rain during the last few days! Everyone knows how much I love rain and how much I love driving in the rain! ***Rain gives me that wonderful feeling of serenity and peace. So you know where I am when it rains!***

And we know that the love of God continues to rain down on us through the Church in many different ways through our liturgical celebrations! The Church as we know is HOLY AND CATHOLIC! What does it mean?

Jesus said in the gospel of John,

“I have told you this so that my joy might be in you and your joy might be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one’s life for one’s friends.”

*Holiness has been described in many different ways. When we speak of the Church as holy we refer to the fact that Christ’s love for the Church makes it holy. **Therefore holiness means that love becomes the motive and the goal of the entire Church.** As members of the Church we are to love each other as Christ loves his Church. **Since the son of God came as the visible sign and expression of God’s love for all, Jesus’ mission then is universal. It means that the love of the Church cannot be confined to just one group or family but it must be offered to all.***

WHAT DOES IT MEAN FOR THE CHURCH TO BE HOLY?

Because of its relationship to the Blessed Trinity the Church having been sanctified by Christ shares in Christ’s power to sanctify others! However, this holiness is imperfect in that we, the members of the Church, have not yet reached perfect holiness. ***But through renewal and through our liturgical and sacramental life of the Church, we can experience the holiness of God.***

HOW IS THE CHURCH CATHOLIC?

The word “catholic” comes from the Greek word *katholikos*. This term was first used by St. Ignatius of Antioch in his letter, ***“Whosoever the bishop shall appear, let the people be, even as where Jesus is, there is the Catholic Church!”*** So it means ***“universal” in the sense of “having the character of totality or wholeness.”*** There are two aspects to this understanding.

First, there is the understanding that comes from the fact that the Church possesses the full and complete means of salvation bestowed upon it by Jesus Christ. ***Second***, there is the universality that comes from the Church’s mission to the entire human family. ***Of course the local Church, we the faith community, the parishes, is an expression of the universal Church that is one, holy, catholic and apostolic.***

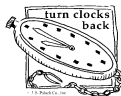

Second Reading — It was not Christ who glorified himself, but rather the one who said to him: You are my son: this day I have begotten you (Hebrews 5:1-6).

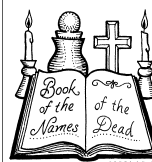
Gospel — Immediately the blind man received his sight and followed Jesus on the way (Mark 10:46-52).

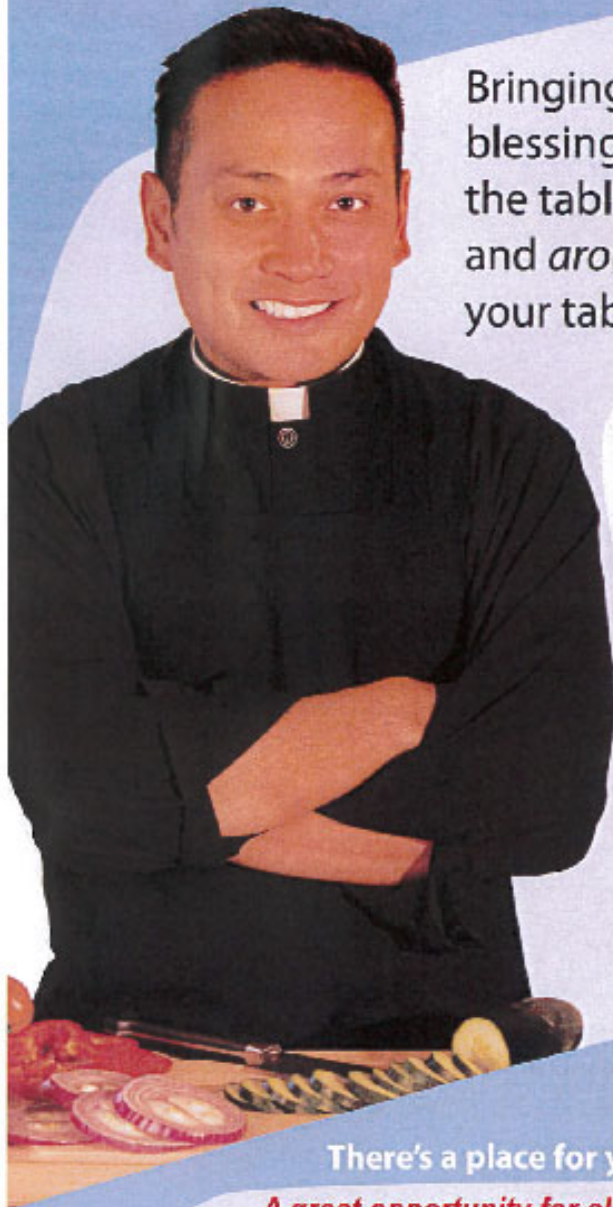
