THE RISEN CHRIST

In this Sunday's first reading and Gospel we see Peter and the other disciples in action after the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. On trial, they refused to stop teaching in Jesus' name, and they rejoiced at the opportunity to suffer for their beliefs. On the lake and its shore, face to face with the Risen Lord, they obeyed his directions and recognized him as he once again ate a meal with them. There are so many human and almost homey touches in these readings! The high priest in the first scene sounds as if he is scolding naughty students. There is an order to stop speaking in Jesus' name, but it is evident everyone knows they will disobey again. And on the lake shore, we can imagine Peter's excitement as he strides out of the water and is greeted by Jesus, who grins and says, "Come, have breakfast."

The second reading, on the other hand, is anything but homey. In this passage from Revelation, John describes a scene in which the same Lord who fed his friends breakfast here receives honor and glory from everything in the universe.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

An ancient title for this Sunday is *Dominica in Albis*, or "Sunday in White." During the Easter Vigil, the newly baptized are invested with a white garment, a sign that they have put on Christ. At one time, the garments were worn for a full week of celebration and reflection, and on this Sunday the newly baptized would appear in their robes again in their new place among the faithful for Eucharist.

In later centuries, the energy of new life at Easter was largely forgotten, and this Sunday was renamed "Quasimodo Sunday," or "Low Sunday." In recent years, with the recovery of the insight that Easter is the privileged time for celebrating and renewing baptism, there is nothing "Low" about this Sunday. At a week's distance, the beauty and grace of our Easter celebration is sustained by joyful alleluias, the blessing and sprinkling of holy water, and the comfort of the Lord's presence to us. He is risen, and he summons us together, opening up the scriptures for us, breaking the bread, filling us with new life.

Confirmation 2012-2013

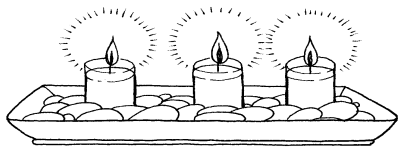

Archbishop Alex J. Brunett will be the principal celebrant at a Mass celebrating the 75th Anniversary of St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP) of Alameda County. The Mass will be a celebration of the organization's service throughout Alameda County and will include Conference members, volunteers, staff, clients, and the community. All are welcome. A reception following Mass will feature food prepared by the SVdP Kitchen of Champions culinary training program.

In the years since its 1938 founding in Alameda county, SVdP has grown and now includes a Community Center in downtown Oakland, which offers a Dining Room, drop-in centers for men, women and children, two job training programs, Homeless and Caring Court, medical clinics, and other basic services; thrift stores in Oakland, Fremont and Livermore; the Redux Studios and Gallery in Alameda; and an electronics waste recycling program – all of which provide revenue to fund the social programs in Oakland and throughout the county. The Vincentian volunteers also provide services to those in need through their Catholic parishes in Alameda County.
