

My dear friends in Christ,

Bishop Michael Barber, welcome! We are indeed honored that you have come to visit us this weekend! We welcome you with joy and with thanksgiving!

I hope that you continue to enjoy this beautiful summer! After that short heat wave that we had some time in June, our days have been filled with mild temperature and wonderful natural sights in the horizon. But for me personally it has been a very challenging one. My father, who is 81 years-old, was taken to the emergency in the first week of July! He was in the hospital for almost two weeks in Kaiser Modesto before being transferred to a rehab center in Hayward. We were not ready for this experience and for this challenge! The good news is that I don't have to travel that far to see and visit him. His health is improving very gradually. Thank you for all your prayers!

What happened to my dad is a great reminder for us that we need to "be ready" always in our journey to life!

The gospel today challenges us not be part-time Christians but to be real Christians all the time. Knowing that judgment may come any time, living according to the gospel all the time is the proper response. In other words, "Be prepared!"

"Be prepared!" This was made popular by the Boy Scouts. This is also the constant call of the gospel. Being a prepared Christian is a daily concern of every Christian!

I always wonder why Jesus didn't give a definite time for this "hour" to come! Probably because people have the tendency to live according to the deadline and not according to the will of God! This tells us that establishing a relationship with God is not dictated by time but by true, authentic and real love for him!

Speaking of being prepared, I am sharing with you the second part of Healthy Living article by SMART on diabetes.

Diabetes: Are You at Risk?

Because some of its symptoms may seem harmless, diabetes often goes undiagnosed. Early detection and treatment can lower your chances of developing diabetes-related complications.

What are the Symptoms?

If you or someone you know have 1 or more of the following symptoms, especially if there is a history of diabetes in your family, contact a physician to find out if you or someone you know may have diabetes: Frequent urination, excessive thirst, extreme hunger, unexplained weight loss, extreme fatigue, irritability and blurry vision.

If you already have diabetes and are experiencing any of these symptoms, it could mean that your diabetes is not being properly controlled. Please contact your physician to create a diabetes action plan.

Prediabetes

People with prediabetes have blood sugar levels that are higher than normal, which increases the risk of developing type 2 diabetes, heart disease, and stroke. About one out of three US adults have prediabetes. The chance of prediabetes becoming type 2 diabetes can be reduced by losing weight with healthy eating and regular physical activity.

Preventing and Lowering Your Risk for Diabetes

- · Having a family history of diabetes increases your risk of developing type 1 or type 2 diabetes. Being overweight and inactive increases your risk of developing type 2 diabetes. Women who develop gestational diabetes during pregnancy (especially those who are African-American) have increased risk for diabetes in the future.
- · You can lower your risk with exercise, healthy eating, and weight loss, even if you've been diagnosed with prediabetes. Small improvements in these areas can make a big impact on your health.

Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Thursday, August 15, 2013 (Holy Day of Obligation)

Mass at 8:00AM and 7:30PM

This Thursday's feast celebrates Mary's Assumption into heaven. It is one of three feasts of Mary that are Holy Days of Obligation for Catholics in the United States. January 1 is the feast of Mary, the Mother of God, and December 8 is the feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary. The assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven has long been held as an important Catholic belief. The belief was not defined as dogma, however, until 1950 by Pope Pius XII. The dogma teaches that Mary, who was without sin, was taken, body and soul, into the glory of heaven.
