***This is a time of thanksgiving and a time of celebration. Many activities and surprises are planned for the weekend festivities and I hope that you can take TIME OFF from your busy work to be part of this gathering***

***This festival weekend is an opportunity for us to come to have fun and to spend time with our friends and family and to celebrate the diversity of our community in worship, faith, age and culture. This is the richness of St. Anne's community. We will experience different kinds of food.***

***There are a lot of things we need to be thankful for and to celebrate. My hope is that we will make a conscious effort to show our own appreciation for God's many blessings by being here and actively participate in the many events and activities of our parish festival. We will have great music and a lot of dancing. Young and old feet will lead to many moments of joy and appreciation. Come with your positive spirit, with your beautiful smile and with a sense of beauty and wonder.***

***The central message of Jesus is that the "kingdom of God" is at hand. This is the kingdom where God's love is revealed and experienced. By preaching this, Jesus wants all of us to be part of this moment. In the parable this weekend, Jesus talks about us living and co-existing together: the wheat and the weeds.***

***With this new understanding, no single group is superior from one another. All of us are the same, one people created in God's love and spirit! All of us received the same invitation to be part of the kingdom. We have been reminded many times that division and ignorance have no place in our community. Jesus broke down the barriers of hatred and prejudices to give way for openness and acceptance. When he touched the leper and when he talked to the Samaritan woman at the Well of Jacob, and when he embraced the sinners and the outcast of the society, those who are rejected and ignored, Jesus ushered in a new era of living in the spirit of love and compassion. So any destructive spirit has no place in "our kingdom" here at St. Anne's!!***

***Come with peace and celebrate with joy in your heart! LET US BE LIGHTS OF HOPE in the world we live in!***

**WHO IS ST. ANNE?**

***We know her as the mother of MARY and GRANDMOTHER of Jesus. In the Holy Scriptures, she was never mentioned. We only know her through tradition especially from the Apocryphal gospels which speak of her abundantly.***

***But what are these so called apocryphal gospels?***

***These are Jewish and ancient Christian writings, similar in the title and subject to the canonical books, but to which the Church never attributed definite canonical authority. The Canonical Books are the authentic list of recognized sacred books, that is, written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit and as such received by the Church.***

***So in the Protevangelium of James, she was described as someone who was from the tribe of Judah, saintly and possessed great herds. The cult of St. Anne spread at first in the East. In the year 550 A.D. Emperor Justinian raised a basilica in her honor at Constantinople. In the West devotions to St. Anne seems to have gained popularity during the time of the crusaders. At one point Pius suppressed her feast but was reestablished by Gregory XIII in 1594.***

***We give thanks to God for the gift of St. Anne. May we always follow her example of life, which is a life of faith, trust and humility.***

## PATIENTLY AWAITING JUDGMENT

Matthew, more than any other evangelist, talks about Jesus leaving and returning home. Often Jesus leaves the house because crowds have assembled outside and want to be taught. Today, after having taught and dismissed the crowds, his disciples follow him home, seeking further explanation of what seem to be, at least to us today, pretty straightforward parables.

For both Matthew and Mark, when Jesus is in the house with his disciples it signals a special teaching moment, and it should cause us today to perk up our ears. Usually it is Jesus giving commonsense advice about what it will mean to follow him. Today is no different. To follow Jesus means to be ready to encounter the followers of evil, to have to live and work and preach among them. It means patiently awaiting the judgment that can only come from God, the judgment of justly deciding who will be thrown into the flame and who will live to be a brightly shining saint. Let us heed this house teaching, for it will be the same for us who follow Jesus Christ today.

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Charlemagne, crowned Holy Roman Emperor on Christmas Day, 800, had a major interest in shaping the worship life of the church, and began a long period of reform and regulation. We owe many confirmation policies and practices to his rule. A baptized person was required to be confirmed as soon as the bishop's presence made it possible. Priests were expected to do their best in seeing to it that a newly-baptized child received the Eucharist. One twelfth-century ritual insists that if the child is not yet capable of eating or drinking, then the priest might give him or her some of the Precious Blood on a leaf or a finger.

Despite the best efforts of the Empire to hold liturgical life together, the rules were not always lived out with great beauty. St. Richard of Chichester of thirteenth-century England, for example, was canonized for his holy life as a bishop. One of the remarkable signs of his sanctity was his willingness to climb down from his horse to confirm "merely baptized" layfolk who crossed his path! This praiseworthy practice points a finger of blame at less zealous bishops, whose casual attitudes revealed a sacrament in need of rescue.
