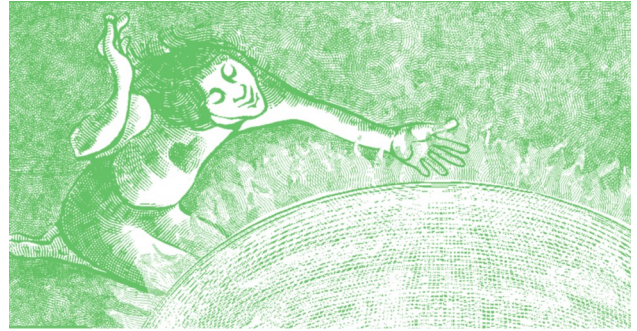

POST-SUMMER CHALLENGES

With any luck, summer delights will continue a while past last weekend's Labor Day: refreshing recreation (with maybe an occasional swim) or enjoyable relaxation on the deck (with tasty outdoor grilling). Truth is, for some of us, this year's Labor Day came way too early. With many schools back in session for a while already, mealtimes and driving schedules needed readjustment to coordinate youth sports with adult commitments. Some religious education and parish programs resumed, too. No surprise, then, that this weekend's scriptures sound a little like post-summer challenges. For instance, Wisdom reminds us that believers in God can never be content with "timid deliberations" and "unsure plans." Paul challenges longtime friend and follower Philemon to "let the good you do be voluntary." Jesus instructs "great crowds" traveling with him—including us—on three things necessary for all true disciples to accomplish. On this early autumn weekend, our scriptures describe disciples' lifelong labors. - Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Eastern Catholic and Orthodox Christians share a love for the Byzantine liturgy because it is during the Eucharist that the Church is most true to its identity, expresses its integrity, and discovers its vocation. Eastern Catholic and Orthodox Christians celebrate essentially the identical liturgy, with only very slight variations. It is a fairly complex ritual weaving together three separate layers of prayers: a liturgy prayed in the sanctuary by priests, often hidden by a curtain or screen; a liturgy sung by the assembly and led by a deacon in front of a screen formed of painted icons; and a third layer of private prayer by the priest, who prays in support of the deacon and the faithful. It is an eyes-wide-open experience, gorgeous in visuals, and filled with the sound of God's people singing prayer. The energy of the worship centers on the presence of Christ, largely through an awareness of heaven touching earth when the Church gathers to celebrate.

In the late twentieth century, Latin Rite Catholics were encouraged to embrace a style of worship that was "full, conscious, and active," a value that has never been lost in the East. The liturgy has great impact in its beauty, in its poetry and contemplation, and by the actions of bowing, signing with the cross, and chanting that are required of the assembly. Adult Faith Formation

What is Adult Faith Formation?

The Church's catechetical mission aims to help the faithful grow in both human and Christian maturity, enriching the whole of life with the leaven of the Gospel. Our Adult Faith Formation consists of three components: **RCIA, Adult Confirmation, and Ongoing Formation**. We aim to build and nourish the faith life of all adults yearning to deepen their relationship with God.

RCIA—The Rite of Christian Initiation

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (commonly known as the RCIA) is the normal way in which adults become full, active, participating members of the Catholic Church. If you, a friend, or family member is interested in becoming catholic, the RCIA is here to fulfill that yearning. Have you, a friend or family member received the sacrament of Baptism in the Catholic Church or another faith, but have not received First Communion and Confirmation? This track is also supports your full initiation.

RCIA will begin in September. Sessions are typically held on the First, Second and Third Sundays beginning at 12:00PM.

Adult Confirmation

The Sacrament of Confirmation is commonly the final Sacrament of Initiation that confirms our Baptism. A large number of Catholics have received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Communion, but, not Confirmation. Many don't realize this until they register to be a valid Godparent and are advised they must be fully initiated Catholics. Our Adult Confirmation program is here to help you fully enter the Catholic Church. This program begins in October and lasts 3 months. Sessions are typically held on the First, Second and Third Wednesday evenings at 7:30PM. Be sealed with the Gifts of the Holy Spirit!

Ongoing Formation

This program is here to support our faith journey with Christ. Whether it be diving deeper into our faith, breaking open the Word of God, strengthening our knowledge so we can better support our Children's faith journey, this program offers several opportunities to journey with one another. We are not in this journey alone. Ongoing Formation sessions will be held year round on a variety of topics. Schedules will be published on our website, parish bulletin and bulletin boards. Sessions will typically be held Tuesdays at 7:30PM
